Over the past year, the Women's Centre has experienced a remarkable journey filled with positive changes and impactful milestones.

Firstly, the introduction of new programs at our secondary location has greatly expanded our reach and accessibility, ensuring that even more women have access to the resources and support they need. We have served over 1,500 participants! Of those, 1,260 are members and their children, and an average of 250 women in our community programs each session.

These programs have been tailored to address specific needs within the community, such as improving proficiency in French and English and providing an educational playgroup for preschoolers in two locations. These groups foster empowerment and solidarity among women from diverse backgrounds.

The Women's Centre experienced its highest ever membership levels, indicating a growing recognition of the importance of our organization within the community. This increased membership not only reflects the trust and confidence placed in us by our supporters but also reinforces our commitment to serving and uplifting women in all aspects of their lives.

Our successful Silent Auction fundraiser last fall was a testament to the generosity and support of our community. Through the collective efforts of volunteers, donors, and attendees, we were able to surpass our fundraising goals, providing vital financial support for our programs and initiatives.

The International Women's Day event hosted by the Women's Centre in March garnered significant attention and participation, becoming a highlight within the community. 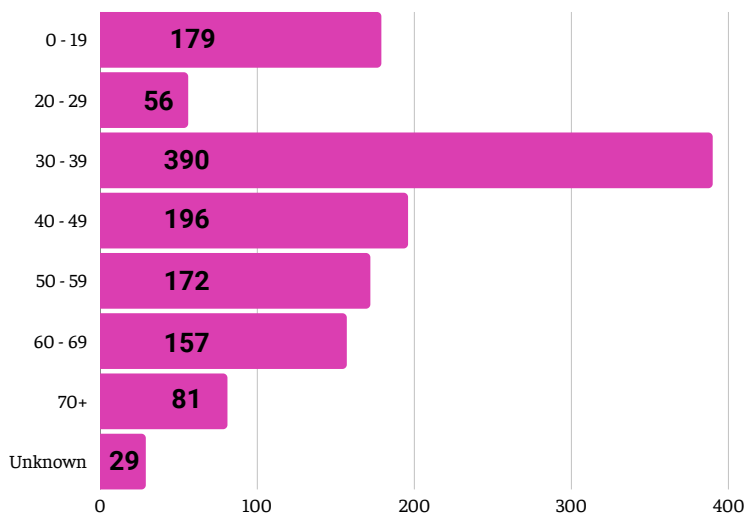
YEAR IN REVIEW

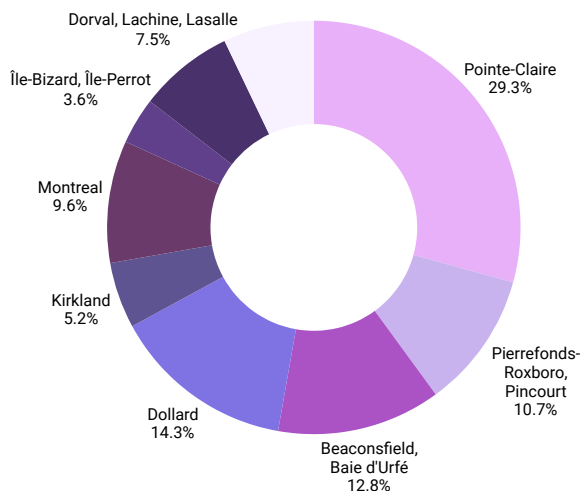

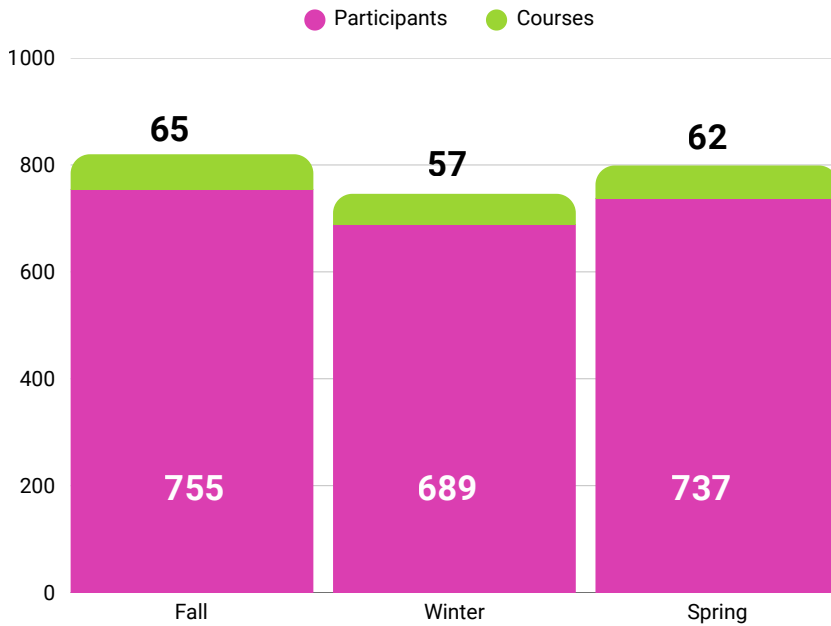

COMMUNITY PARTNERS

We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to our community partners who we actively collaborated with over the past year:



In 2024, we combined forces in a pilot project with the West Island Community Resource Centre to hire a Resource and Support Agent at the Centre. With the expertise in information and referral services, our agent, Jillian Lalonde, was able to support over 40 women between April and June. Our members and women from the community received information, resources and support related to topics such as legal issues, relationships, parenting, employment, mental health support etc. We are looking forward to establishing permanent funding to continue with this shared partnership that will help even more vulnerable women in the future.



In 2023-2024, our friends at Corbeille de pain held several workshops and community kitchens for our members. The Centre offered our free childcare service during the community kitchen in Pierrefonds. Women from the Centre were able to participate in workshops related to shopping on a budget, knife skills, cooking with pantry staples, etc. They also prepared fresh meals that they could take home.



Every month, our 55 Up! women's group prepares and delivers freshly prepared meals for the Mission's most vulnerable clients. With the rise in food prices, these fresh meals go a long way in helping those who are facing food insecurity. We will continue with this partnership over the next year as a part of our community giving back program.



The Centre is a breastfeeding-friendly location and is happy to partner with Nourri-Source each year to provide new moms the opportunity to speak with and receive support from a lactation consult every Friday morning. Between the months of September to June, Nourri-Source supports over 100 number of women and their babies.

We had an amazing group of instructors this year. It is always wonderful to see their smiling faces when they come in for their courses. They are a group of dedicated women (and men!) who pride themselves on making a difference in the lives of women! We thank them for helping us to grow as an organization!



CHILDCARE SERVICE

This year our childcare service has continued to grow steadily with each session. Our new satellite location in Pierrefonds and Saturday childcare in Pointe Claire have seen significant growth. In Pierrefonds, we started with 3 children in September 2023, and now have 14 in total for the Spring 2024 session.

Saturday childcare has also taken off! In September 2023 we welcomed 8 children, and we currently have 21 children registered in April 2024. We also have noticed a difference in the ages of children we care for during the week compared with Saturdays.

During the week over half of the children we have in childcare are under one year old, while on Saturdays most of the children are over two years old. We are now offering childcare earlier in the mornings three days a week at 8:45 am and two afternoons we have childcare ending after 3:30 pm. As we grow as an organization, our childcare service has also pivoted to support women's schedules outside the Centre's typical opening hours.

In Fall 2023, parents and grandparents attended our Halloween and Holiday parties with their little ones. We had face painting, photography, and music at our Halloween party. The Holiday Party in December was well attended with older siblings who were home due to the school strike. We also offered occasional childcare for children during the school strike so that moms could continue to take their classes. Many moms brought their school aged children during their classes!

EVENTS

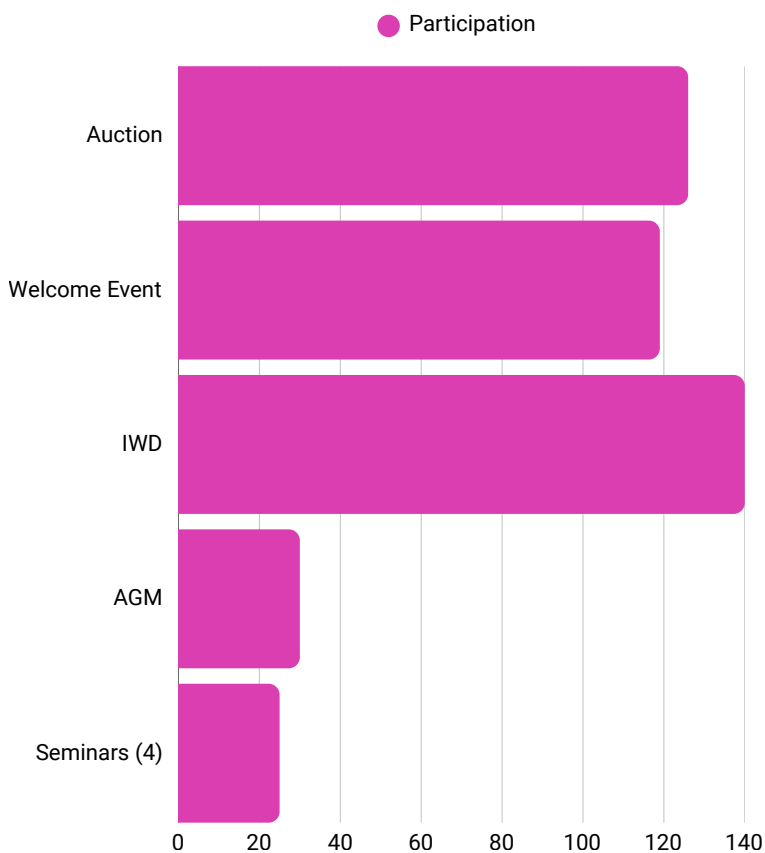
The Women's Centre had a very busy year! We hosted over 440 guests at our various events and activities.

Our Annual Welcome Back event was held in September 2023. With the support of Belron Canada employees, we organized an outdoor Family BBQ for new and returning members to enjoy. We followed that up with our Annual Silent Auction, our first post-COVID fundraising event that raised more than \$19,000 in proceeds for the Centre's programs. We finished off 2023 with our members once again showing their generosity by donating food and personal hygiene products for women and their families in need during the holidays.

2024 started off strong with a very successful International Women's Day Celebration event featuring two amazing guest speakers: Joan Lee from WIBCA Montreal and Thi Be Nguyen from the Canada-ASEAN Business Council who shared their wealth of experience about building inclusive communities that invest in women.

The Centre also participated in Family Day in Pierrefonds, Holiday Tree decorating contest at the Plaza Pointe-Claire, breakfast with West Island Community Shares, and co-organized a tea for seniors. We also held 4 seminars on topics such as menopause, estate planning, giving birth with a midwife and laughter therapy. Over 25 members of the community attended our seminars in 2023-2024.

The year ahead promises to be an exciting one, filled with engaging events that will empower, inspire, and create positive change for the women in our community.

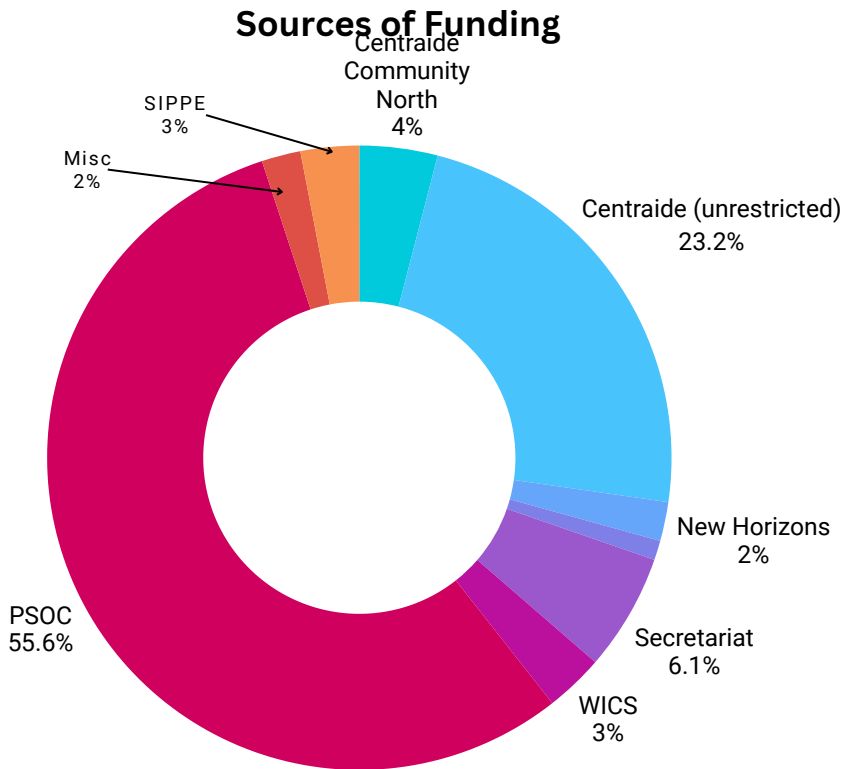

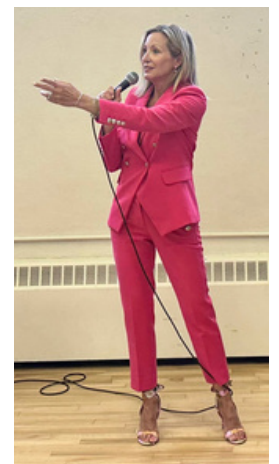

50th Anniversary of the Women's Centre

In 2025, we will be highlighting 50 years of empowering women in the West Island community. A special event to mark the occasion will be planned!

Strategic Planning

In 2024-2025, the Board of Directors, staff and WIWC stakeholders will embark on the vision and strategic planning process that will set the goals and objectives of the Centre for the next 5 years (until 2030).

Fund Development Strategies

Over the next year, the Centre will actively be focusing on ways to engage new partnerships, new sources of funding for our programs, planned investments in marketing and implement fundraising campaigns that will help support the longevity of the Centre.

Support for new arrivals and vulnerable women

In 2025, we would like to continue our collaboration with the West Island Community Resource Centre by offering our Resource and Support Agent as a permanent service. We would also like to continue to offer tailored support to our newly arrived women through our New Connections programs that include language classes, integration support and network building.

Adapting and evolving to meet emergent needs

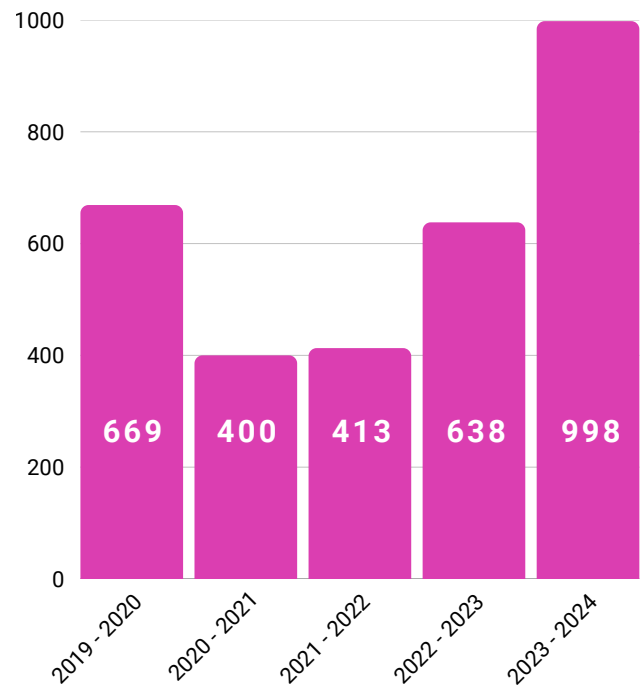
To meet the needs of women, continue to adapt and offer flexible programming options, including extending our childcare program beyond our typical hours. With emergent needs such as legal, relationship and parenting support, we wish to expand our offerings to include access to free consultants such as a lawyer or a psycho-educator. We would also like to expand our offering to our 55+Up women's group with specialized courses and activities at our second location.

The Women's Centre has the potential to grow and expand its reach significantly in the future. Through continuous innovation, community engagement, and a commitment to its mission, the Centre can create lasting change and transform the lives of countless women and children.

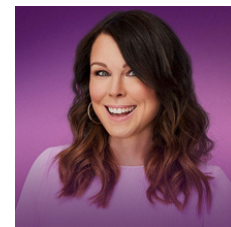
